OBERON MULTI-PURPOSE SPORTS & COMMUNITY COMPLEX

It was an auspicious day in Oberon on Tuesday 13 February turning the first sod on the new sports facility that will house multiple sporting codes including rugby league, netball and hockey.

The multi-sports complex located at the entrance to Oberon has been jointly funded by the State and Federal Governments under the Bushfire Local Economic Recovery project and is supported by Oberon Council and Borg.

At the dinner we have two guest speakers from our community who will provide quite different perspectives on their journey in life so far. There will be a raffle, trivia, and a variety of prizes.

Over the month of March there are several events planned celebrating seniors within our local government area. Seniors lunches will be held in Oberon and Burraga whilst my highlight will be the Premiers Gala Concert held at the Oberon Library and Community Centre. This event will be live streamed and accompanied by an afternoon tea.

On 13 February 2024 I was lucky enough to stand with our State Member, Mr Paul Toole our Federal Member, Mr Andrew Gee together with representatives of Mr John Borg in turning the first sod for the new Oberon Sporting Complex. This partnership has allowed a dream to become a reality.

There was an enormous amount of work by Council staff and various State Government organisations to ensure we achieve this once in a generation project.

The Sports Complex is being built to provide two rugby league grounds, netball courts a grass hockey pitch initially with the objective being a contemporary synthetic pitch funded by the Council. The complex will include a club area with bar and food service facilities available to all Oberon sporting organisations, four change rooms to permit concurrent male and female teams to use the grounds and a grand stand for about 280 people. The input from sports organisations to the design of these facilities was substantial and very important.

The earth works currently underway will continue for another month or so with the final completion of the facility around the third quarter of 2025.

It promises to be a great facility!

Oberon Council Rating Structure Review -Town Improvement Levy

Oberon Council is currently undertaking a process of public consultation in relation to a review of the Town Improvement Levy.

The Town Improvement Levy is collected from every assessable property within the designated Town Improvement boundary to fund improvements in that area.


In 2023-24 the Town Improvement Levy will raise \$555,722 and Council nominated the following projects through the Integrated Planning and Reporting Process (IP&R)

- Kerb and Gutter improvements
- Construction of the Oberon Library and Community Centre
- Continued beautification and recreation works at the Oberon Common
- Footpath Upgrades
- Drainage improvements at Richards Park
- Bulky goods collection

Council is undertaking a review of the Town Improvement Levy to ensure the equity and outcomes of

the rating structure are still relevant for our community. This process includes a thorough consultation process to gather input and consensus on the most appropriate pathway forward for the future of the Town Improvement Levy.

ratepayers have raised concerns that any adjustments to the Town Improvement Levy will result in an increase to Council's income. This is not the case, the total revenue generated by rates is capped and subject to the specification of a percentage variation by Independent Pricing and Regulatory Tribunal (IPART). Accordingly, any adjustments to the Levy will not generate any additional revenue for Oberon Council.






