EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW BASIC FIRST AID DEFIBRILLAOR PRACTICE

An informal First Aid course was run in Oberon in March, another is proposed for October. Health professional, Fiona Taylor, from Tailored First Aid, conducted the first course at Oberon RSL Club and was very pleased with the outcome.

"I was approached to run a course that would cover basic emergency situations. It ran over three hours on one evening and included CPR and an introduction to defibrillators". Neil Francis from Burraga learnt how to perform CPR on a mannequin under the guidance of Fiona Taylor.

"The people who attended this course had no need for a certificate at the end. Many of them don't come to town that often and are reluctant to give up daylight hours when they could be working. The idea was to give basic skills to people who live and/or work in isolated areas, where an Ambulance might not be quickly available. It was aimed, mainly, at farm workers but we had a bit of a cross-section on the night, including tradesmen."

"We had nearly thirty people at the course so the cost was very low. If we only have twelve people, it would cost about \$60.00, but this is a very small cost to upskill someone so they know what to do in an emergency, before an Ambulance arrives".

The impetus for some people to do the course came when a two-year-old girl had an encounter with a snake at Porters Retreat in February, and that was followed by a tiger snake bite to a farm worker near Rockley about two weeks later.

"It is when something like that happens to someone close to us that we realise we need to be prepared," said Mrs Taylor. "Everyone who attended the course seemed very pleased with their learning and suggested that there should be more of these courses for the people of Oberon and surrounds."

Mrs Sue Luther attended the First Aid course in Oberon and is adamant that everyone needs to have basic first aid skills. Sue said, "It is really everyone's responsibility to have as much knowledge as they can get. If there is an accident or someone suddenly becomes seriously ill, you can't just expect an Ambulance to turn up in a matter of minutes. Even if that did happen, sometimes you need to react immediately. She added, "It might not help you, but it might save someone else's life and that someone else could be someone you love. This course was terrific and I would recommend it to everyone."

The next course is proposed for Monday, 16 October, 6:30pm to 9:30pm at the RSL Club, depending on interest. For further information and/or to book a spot in the course, please contact Deborah Hoolihan on 0427 558 706.

There are three major building projects on the Council's agenda that will vastly improve the social and utility infrastructure for the township and our entire community.

The first build was the new Library and Community Centre which has been completed with a few last touches to be installed in the auditorium. This building project came in under the approved budget.

The second big item is the new Sewage Treatment Plant (STP). It will be adjacent to the current STP but has newer technology and a greater capacity to satisfy the demands of Oberon well into the 2040s. The detailed design for this project is due this month which will allow the project to progress to tender.

The Sports Complex will be located opposite the roundabout on the O'Connell Road and is planned to include two Rugby League grounds, Netball courts, and a current standard Hockey facility. There will also be a substantial grandstand, male and female changerooms and clubroom facilities.

This project has been made possible with funding from the Australian and NSW Governments as well as a partnership with Borg to construct Stage 1 of the facility. Stage 2 of the project will include installation of netball courts and a synthetic hockey turf.



This project is gathering momentum and will soon achieve some substantial milestones.

Many of you will have seen the concept design for the complex. The detailed design is now well underway. Work on the detailed design of the sporting grounds and the grandstand/changerooms continues and will be subject to review by stakeholders and will be placed on public exhibition for comment prior to consideration of approval.

Contracts are now in place for the sale of the Borg owned land to Council. This sale will be finalised prior to the end of September unlocking one of the major milestones of the Grant Deed.

Borg continue to work on demonstrating to the Grants Authority their construction capability and capacity requirements that will assure the project is completed to the expectation of all parties. Public Works Advisory (PWA) is the NSW State Government expert in Project Management and is assisting Council (and the State Government) in this very complex acquisition and construction process.

This funding has been made available through the Local Economic Recovery fund jointly funded by the Australian and the New South Wales Governments under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements. Additional funding has been allocated through the

Federal Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Grant.

This project is a once in a generation project for the Oberon Community and we appreciate greatly the goodwill demonstrated by our partners in this project; The Federal Government and NSW Government together with Borg Pty Ltd.




OFFERS NEW EVENTS IN TERMS 3 AND 4
